Buckeye Recipe

(WIA Youth made these at our Christmas Party... yum!)

Prep Time: 15minutes Ready In: 50minutes Cook Time: 5minutes

Servings: 30

Ingredients:

1½ cups peanut butter6 cups confectioners' sugar1 cup butter, softened4 cups semi sweet chocolate chips½ teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

- 1. In a large bowl, mix together the peanut butter, butter, vanilla, and confectioners' sugar. The dough will look dry. Roll into 1 inch balls and place on a waxed paper lined cookie sheet.
- 2. Press a toothpick into the top of each ball (to be used later as the handle for dipping) and chill in freezer until firm, about 30minutes.
- 3. Melt chocolate chips in a double boiler or in a bowl set over a pan of barely simmering water. Stir frequently until smooth.
- 4. Dip frozen peanut butter balls in chocolate holding onto the toothpick. Leave a small portion of peanut butter showing at the top to make them look like a buckeye. Put back on the cookie sheet and refrigerate until ready to serve.
